Over the last couple of months we have experienced an increase in Dog Fouling on our streets in Deenethorpe.

The Local Dog Warden is aware of this and we wish to remind dog owners there is a £100 penalty for failing to clean up after their dog.

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Village Green

You will have seen the work done one Sunday morning by various residents of Deene & Deenethorpe to clear the Green and remove the excess vegetation. We would like to say a VERY BIG THANK YOU to all those people who took part. Bulbs have been planted for the spring and we feel there may be a need to have another working party in the spring to stop the weeds and brambles. We will let people know when a date has been arranged.

One Way System in Deenethorpe

This has now been approved and we are waiting for Northants County Council to finalise the design of the signs. NCC also has to publish the plans so that people can object if they wish. When the consultation process has been carried out the Parish Council will be notified when the change to the road system is going to take place.

The Parish Council has been approached by some residents of Deenethorpe who would like a 30MPH speed limit through the village. NCC has agreed to this and when they have a number of villages requiring a change of speed limits they will apply to Parliament for agreement. The positioning of the signs has been agreed.

Deenethorpe Airfield Development

The Parish Council had two representatives invited to a meeting with the Developers in December 2012. The actual plans have not yet been finalised nor have they been submitted to East Northants Council for approval. The 20yrs structure plan has not been agreed.

The Airfield is approx. 600 acres of which 60 will be used for the new village. There will be

between 1000 – 1250 homes built. Also a hotel (50/60 bedded) schools including a secondary school for 500 pupils.

Homes will be built at the rate of 50/60 per year making it a 20 year development.

There will be two roads into the village, 1 off the A427 where the current entrance to the hangers and Airfield is located. The 2nd is a new road from the existing hangers and coming out by Lodge Farm on to the A43. Both entrances will need roundabouts.

There will be many areas that will be traffic free and residents will be discouraged from using cars. The X4 bus will be diverted to provide a bus service to the village. No upgrades of the A43 or the A427 are planned.

It is expected that 400 jobs will be created for village people in the schools, Doctors, Shops, Hotel, stables so these people will not require cars but public transport to get out of the village.

The land will be released by Brudenell Estates as and when it is needed and to bring together businesses and homes as they are needed. The land will NOT be sold to a major developer but released on the same basis as Pondbury which this is all based on. The homes we are told will be either Freehold or Social housing.

What happens to the air strip- it will all be ploughed up. There will be local cycle ways, lots of public footpaths and bridleways for the stables.

Timescale is 1 year for consultancy, 1 year to obtain planning approval, and to start development in 2018.
